



Appointment of Principal and Vice-Chancellor

The role of Principal & Vice-Chancellor is crucial in guiding us towards this future and maintaining our culture of ambition through excellence and inclusivity.



The University of Strathclyde is a leading international technological university that is socially progressive, based in the centre of Glasgow.

Our highly valued and innovative staff ensure that all of our students benefit from a distinctive curriculum that builds academic excellence and provides opportunities to widen our students' knowledge and experience.

We make significant investments in fundamental research, recognising that this will pave the way for the disruptive discoveries of tomorrow. The quality of our research and our reputation for challenging conventional thinking make us the partner of choice for a growing number of organisations and other universities around the world.

At the same time, our unequalled links with business, industry and the public sector – and our leading role in two innovation districts – empower us to tackle local, national and global problems, respond to the grand challenges of our time, and bring solutions and services to market more quickly.

Through our 1000 academic staff, we are at the forefront of international research across our four faculties – Engineering, Science, Humanities & Social Sciences and our Business School.

We are ranked amongst the top universities in the world for our positive contribution to achieving the United Nation's (UN)
Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)¹.

The excellence of our research is evidenced by the growth in range and scale of our research collaborations and by our performance in the Research Excellence Framework 2021, where almost 90% was rated 'world-leading' or 'internationally excellent'.

Strathclyde's ambitions – laid out in our Strategic Plan, **Strathclyde 2030** – and our contribution to excellence in research, innovation and education have been recognised through a series of national awards.

We have been named Times Higher
Education UK University of the Year in 2019
and 2012 – the only university to have won
the award twice – and the Sunday Times
Scottish University of the Year 2020.

We are also a four-times winner of the prestigious Queen's Anniversary Prize for Higher and Further Education, most recently in 2023 in recognition of our strength in Photonics. We are placed 8th in the Daily Mail's UK University Guide and are in the UK top 20 in The Guardian's University League Table and Sunday Times Good University Guide.

1 The Times Higher Education Impact Rankings 2024 puts Strathclyde at joint 25th in the world out of 1,963 universities included in the overall ranking, and 4th in the UK.

Over the past 15 years, the Strathclyde community has worked together to create a platform for sustained achievement, building delivery on a clear, values-led, strategy.

Over the next strategic planning period, Strathclyde 2030, the focus on values-led excellence and impact will continue, and we will deliver ongoing success that we all contribute to and can celebrate.

Our digital strategy is about more than technology and software and is rooted in the needs of our people and the effectiveness of our processes. We will work to use digital technology and data to transform processes across our operations to continue to evolve these for a leading international technological university.

We are committed to cutting our carbon emissions and achieving Net Zero by 2040 to play our part in tackling the climate emergency.



In all that we do, Strathclyde is committed to putting our people first – students, staff and partners – and to ensuring that our University is a place of belonging and wellbeing where individual and collective successes are achieved through the support provided for one another.

Our People Strategy places staff at the heart of our plans, recognising that their collective talents, efforts and commitment will deliver our vision for the future. We value the diversity of our student and staff communities and seek to create a culture where everyone is welcome and thrives within our institution. We are committed to achieving and promoting equality of opportunity in our learning, teaching, research and working environments, and to ensuring these environments support positive relations between people, and a culture of respect.

Building on our commitment to equity, diversity, inclusion and participation, we are dedicated to being an anti-racist institution; one that actively opposes racism.

We are equally determined to incorporating safety in every area of University life through our tailored safeguarding framework – Safe360°.

Innovation Districts

We play a leading role in two innovation districts: Glasgow City Innovation District and the Advanced Manufacturing Innovation District Scotland in Renfrewshire.

Glasgow City Innovation District is a hub for entrepreneurship and collaboration and is supporting companies who locate here to accelerate growth, improve productivity, and access Strathclyde's world-class talent and research in areas including 5G communications, health tech, quantum, industrial informatics, FinTech and Space.

GCID is home to over 1,600 businesses and forms a key part of the city's and region's thriving tech ecosystem – one of the fastest growing – hosting more than 950 startups and scale ups with a collective enterprise value of £4.1 billion.

The University of Strathclyde also operates the National Manufacturing Institute Scotland (NMIS), a flagship facility at the heart of the Advanced Manufacturing Innovation District Scotland adjacent to Glasgow International Airport.

A magnet for innovation in advanced manufacturing, the NMIS group of specialist research and developments centres, supports manufacturing, engineering and associated tech businesses of all sizes, to thrive domestically and internationally through accelerating productivity, embracing new digital technologies and achieving net-zero targets.

Global Strathclyde

Strathclyde is at the heart of an international innovation network with leading universities around the world, including Stanford, NYU, MIT, Caltech, Tsinghua, Nanyang Technological University, and National University of Singapore, to name a few.

We have expanded our offering in the Middle East when, in partnership with the world's largest female University, we became the first UK university to establish a presence in Saudi Arabia, to deliver teaching in technology, engineering, science, business and humanities, as part of a movement in the country to expand the role of women in the fields of STEM, business and in wider society.

In Bahrain, where we have been delivering MBA teaching since 1995, we recently opened a hub with our strategic learning and teaching partners, S Eleven Educational, offering a range of programmes across Engineering, Science and Business.

We attract forward-thinking companies and organisations, including: the UK's first Fraunhofer Centre and the Fraunhofer UK-HQ – Europe's largest contract research organisation; the Rolls-Royce University Technology Centre; Entrepreneurial Scotland; the Scottish Centre of Excellence for Satellite Applications; the Weir Advanced Research Centre; the Offshore Renewable Energy Catapult; DHI –the Digital Health and Care Institute; the Industrial Biotechnology Innovation Centre (IBioIC); and the UK

National Facility for pharmaceutical manufacturing alongside our hub for Continuous Manufacturing and Crystallisation (CMAC).

We have forged many historic links with industry, locally and globally to help develop solutions that have an impact. Further along the River Clyde, a specialist centre within the National Manufacturing Institute Scotland (NMIS), our Advanced Forming Research Centre has been at the heart of Scottish manufacturing research for over 15 years and is a globally recognised centre of excellence in innovative manufacturing technologies. Through our operation of NMIS, Strathclyde is supporting the development of Scotland's second innovation district, the Advanced Manufacturing Innovation District Scotland (AMIDS).

- Passionately pursue the University's net zero agenda and ensure sustainability is built into the University's strategic planning and operational delivery.
- Ensure the University continues to deliver world leading research to address local, national and global challenges.



Perrett Laver will conduct preliminary interviews with long-listed candidates in mid-January 2025, following which the Committee will meet to decide upon a shortlist of candidates.

These individuals will be invited to assessments and informal interactions in February and March 2025. Subsequently, final selection will take place on Tuesday 25th March 2025.
